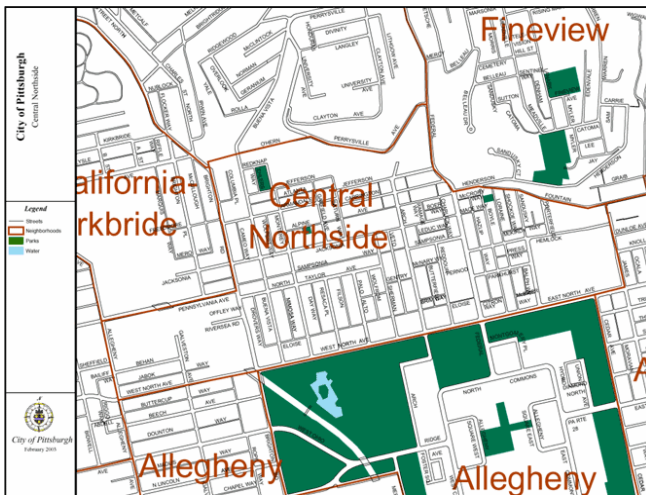


What is the Central Northside?

The Central Northside is a community located on the Northside of Pittsburgh. Nearly 3,000 people live in an area bounded on the east, by Allegheny General Hospital and on the west, by Brighton Road. The Allegheny Commons Park is the southern boundary. A diverse neighborhood, the CNNC is proud to represent the residents of the Central Northside.

West Park Court—CNNC constructed 110 low-income senior apartments

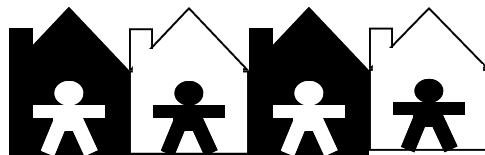
Arch Court—CNNC created 31 low-income senior residences

Parkhurst Project—Built 3 new town homes and completed streetscape improvements.

Federal Hill—\$15 million three-phase project that will include 60 new three-story homes

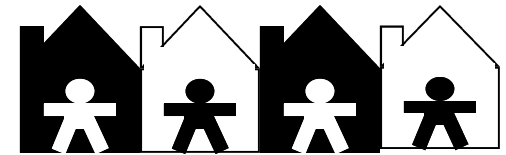

CNNC's Active Resident-Led Committees

Bridges – conducts outreach to the neighborhood. Members go door-to-door to discuss the neighborhood, and also build relationships with residents by organizing social events for people to get to know each other. Meets on the 1st Monday of each month, 6:30pm at Arch Court.

Community Planning Initiatives – is in the process of developing a Neighborhood Plan that will comprehensively address the development of the Central Northside. Meets on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month, 6pm at Arch Court.

Community Safety – considers ways to improve quality of life in the neighborhood by addressing issues involving youth, neighbor relations, and policing. Meeting time and place TBD, call for more info!

Federal North Development – addresses the development of the Federal North business corridor. Meets on the 4th Thursday of each month, 6pm at Arch Court.

Litter and Beautification – pursues beautification projects and vacant lot maintenance projects. Meets on the 3rd Thursday of each month, 6:30pm at Arch Court.

Membership – recruits new members and communicates to the neighborhood events for the CNNC. Meets on the 1st Wednesday of each month, 6pm at Arch Court.

Mission

Founded in 1970, the CNNC is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that represents the residents of the Central Northside neighborhood. The organization has 300 paid members, who serve on committees, meet monthly, and annually elect a board of directors. CNNC has sponsored or developed over 200 units of affordable rental units and for-sale homes, and has 94 more units under development. The CNNC offers resources to residents interested in jobs, home repair and improvement, and youth and social services.

Vision: The vision of the Central Northside Neighborhood Council is to create a safe, clean, affordable, and engaged community.

Come to a Community Meeting

The CNNC holds monthly general membership meetings that are open to the public. It is at these meetings that new initiatives are born and new ideas are discussed. Come out and join the community building in your neighborhood.

Meetings are held every second Monday of the month at 1310 Arch Street at 7pm.

There are no meetings in December or August.

Youth GIS Internship

In March 2008, the CNNC hired five youth interns who live on the Northside, ages 14-18. During the school year, the interns work part-time and full-time during the summer. CNNC staff is training the interns to utilize open-source Geographic Information Systems (GIS), a digital, map-based data management system that police and fire departments, architecture and urban planning firms, and government agencies use to collate and organize data. The youth internship program serves multiple purposes:

1. Provide the neighborhood with customized data and maps for community planning, project and neighborhood needs.
2. Empower younger community members to participate meaningfully in community planning.
3. Provide quality employment for neighborhood youth.
4. Train youth in marketable skills that are directly transferable to many career paths.

Membership

Membership dues entitle residents of the Central Northside to voting privileges at CNNC general membership meetings.

- Dues are \$5 for adults and \$3 for seniors
- CNNC encourages local businesses or organizations to join at \$25 per membership
